




A History of the Victorian Bar

In 1841 in Port Phillip's new Supreme Court a young Redmond Barry argued that the evidence against two Tasmanian Aboriginals accused of murder was quite insufficient for conviction – to no avail. In January 1842 the first execution took place in front of 3000 spectators. Four decades later, the eminent Redmond was to sentence Ned Kelly to death.

In 1855 the 13 Eureka rebels were tried for High Treason – a hanging offence. The jury wasn't having it.

These were just three of many dramatic incidents in our early history, and countless others have since played out in our courts, under a system of justice in which barristers are the contestants.

The author describes the Victorian Bar as a collective of individuals. The reader will find many great figures of the Law and of Politics – and a vanguard of activists who have pressed for human rights and social progress.



# Forgotten Island

Australia, Realism and the Timor Crisis

Why did liberal Australia, led by an erudite social democrat in Gough Whitlam, look away and even become culpably involved in Indonesia's 1975 invasion of Timor, contrary to principles Australia and Whitlam espoused?

Bruce Watson places Timor at the centre of powerful forces beyond its control: post-war decolonisation, Portugal's Carnation Revolution, the Cold War, regional security and Australia's quest to find a new role in Asia.

His aim is to resolve the contested issue concerning Australia's 'greenlighting' of Indonesian President Suharto in advance of the invasion, an exercise in *realpolitik* against what was to the rest of the world a Forgotten Island.



# The Depopulation Imperative

The current world population is 7.9 billion people. Our demands are already making a massive impact on the earth. Global warming, biodiversity loss, resource depletion, these are all symptoms of a bigger problem, human numbers and excessive consumption. Given our impact on earth now we have to reduce our numbers rapidly. We don't have time to wait until 2100 for numbers to decrease gradually. After looking at all of the issues surrounding the population debate, *The Depopulation Imperative* argues that to achieve any reduction we need a profound moral change from an emphasis on the priority of the human to a new basic moral principle that puts the earth first. While the implications of this principle are radical, in the end the book argues that we can do it and there are grounds for hope.




